Lesson Plan: "The Flu: Understanding a Common

Sickness"

Age Group: 5 years and up

Duration: 30 minutes

Objective:

Students will understand what the flu is, how it spreads, and how they can prevent it and take care of themselves if they get sick.

Materials Needed:

- Video Tutorial by DiscoverlifeSkills.com: "The Flu: Understanding a Common Sickness"
- Hand sanitizer
- Tissues
- Chart paper and markers
- Flu prevention and care coloring pages (optional)

Introduction (5 minutes):

1. Greeting & Discussion:

 Start with: "Today, we're going to learn about the flu. Have you ever heard of it before? It's a common sickness that can make us feel unwell."

2. Explain the Concept:

 Briefly explain what the flu is and why it's important to understand it: "The flu is caused by tiny germs called viruses. We're going to learn how to stay healthy and what to do if we get sick."

Main Activity (20 minutes):

1. Watch the Video (5 minutes):

- Play the video tutorial "The Flu: Understanding a Common Sickness."
- Ask students to pay attention to what the flu is, how it spreads, and how they can prevent it.

2. Discussion and Activities (15 minutes):

• What is the Flu?:

- Show how to cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or elbow when coughing or sneezing.
- Discuss staying away from people who are sick.

• What to Do If You Get Sick:

- Emphasize the importance of resting, drinking fluids, and taking medicine if prescribed by a doctor.
- Encourage asking an adult for help and taking good care of themselves.

3. Interactive Activity:

• Flu Prevention Chart:

Create a large chart on paper with the students.
Have them draw or write down ways to prevent the
flu, like handwashing, using tissues, and covering
sneezes.

• Role Play:

 Practice proper handwashing and sneezing etiquette with students. Use hand sanitizer and tissues as props.

Conclusion (5 minutes):

1. Recap the Key Points:

 Review what the flu is, how it spreads, and what students can do to stay healthy and take care of themselves if they get sick.

2. **Q&A**:

 Invite students to ask questions about the flu and its prevention. Answer their questions in simple, clear terms.

3. Optional Activity:

 Hand out flu prevention and care coloring pages for students to complete as a take-home activity.

Extension Ideas:

- Create a Flu Safety Poster: Have students create posters about flu prevention to display in the classroom.
- **Story Time**: Read a children's book related to health and hygiene to reinforce the lesson.

This lesson will help students understand the flu, how to prevent it, and how to care for themselves if they become sick, all in an engaging and age-appropriate manner.
